


## **Eternal Light**

## Walking with Those Who Grieve.

The holiday season can be difficult for people who are grieving a death of deep loss. As Christians, we do well to be aware that not everyone feels wholehearted joy this time of year.

Grief counselor Alan Wolfelt explains that walking alongside — "companioning — one who grieves "is not about being totally present to the mourner, even being a temporary guardian of [his or] her soul."

Among Wolfelt's 11 tenets for "companioning the bereaved":

- It's about being present to another person's pain, not taking it away.
- It's about listening with the heart, not analyzing with the head.
- It's about walking alongside, not leading.


