



## FROM THE PASTOR

The crass world of commercialization has stolen the meaning of one of the most sacred days of the year. The worship of the almighty dollar has replaced the adoration of the Son of God. This encroachment is reinforced by the nonstop claptrap of Xmas music on the radio beginning at Thanksgiving. I say Xmas because the Christmas carols and Christ have been quietly purged from the play lists of holiday music. I don't mean to be a grinch, but I believe he has stolen Christmas.

Why, every year, are we looking for the latest fad or decorating idea to replace the ancient story of a baby, the Son of the Living God, being born in a stable in Bethlehem during tax season? Perhaps it's the humble accommodations God chose; a dusty stable, cobwebs, the smell of manure. Or the young couple, alone, in a strange town. Surely, his Heavenly Father could have done better. Perhaps, we have become accustomed to the quaintness of the story and feel its familiarity needs a bit of updating, modernizations to be 'with it'. Much to the chagrin of contemporary thinking, on a specific day, in a specific year, Jesus, the Son of God, was born in a particular city, Bethlehem, to a particular couple, Mary and Joseph, to redeem us from our sins.








# PONDERINGS AT THE END OF THE DAY/YEAR

Dutch Catholic priest and theologian Henri Nouwen found it useful to reflect on several questions at the end of the day: "Did I offer peace today? Did I bring a smile to someone's face? Did I say words of healing? Pondering such questions may prove valuable at the end of the year as well:"How did I contribute to peace in the world this past year? Did I bring a smile to others' faces? Did I offer words of healing?" Nouwen continues, and we can too: "Did I let go of my anger and resentment? Did I forgive: Did I love?"

Many of us set New Year's resolutions for self-improvement, asking "What are my goals? How can I better myself, my weight, my work-life balance, my habits?" But Nouwen said of his self-inquiry: "These are the real questions. I must trust that the little bit of love that I sow now will bear many fruits, here in this world and [in] life to come." His resolution was to share God's love with others. With God's help, it can be ours as well, for each new day and each new year.


