The Freedom Found in Loving Relationships

"For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters, only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become enslaved to one another. 14 For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

- Galatians 5:13-14

Has your conscious ever got the best of you? Have you ever held back love, compassion or even service towards others because it was an inconvenience or limited what you wanted to do? I mean, freedom is life without consequences, right?

"As servants of God, live as free people, yet do not use your freedom as a pretext for evil."

Sometimes we are like the young boy who had just gotten his driving permit. He asked his father if they could discuss the use of the car. His father said to him, "I'll make a deal with you. You bring your grades up, study your Bible a little and get your hair cut and we'll talk about it."

After about a month the boy came back and again asked his father if they could discuss the use of the car. His father said, "Son, I've been really proud of you. 13 You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love.

14 For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Galatians 5:13 14

Scripture tells us that we only become free in healthy loving relationships that involve mutual, unselfish service, and a mutual loss of independence. True freedom is not the absence of limitations and consequences but finding the right ones that fit our nature and liberate us.

1 Peter 2:16 tells us that our liberation is found when we "As servants of God, live as free people, yet do not use your freedom as a pretext for evil." True freedom is not fooling ourselves that we can have freedom without consequences!






