We welcome all children, who have completed Kindergarten through the eighth grade. We are also offering High School volunteer hours for any youth that helps during Choir Camp.


Spread the word, and make plans to join in the fun. We already have children registered.

Volunteers are needed to help with snacks, crafts, games, and costumes. If you are able to help please contact Beth Herndon.


It's A Miracle!

To Forgive

"Put aside all bitterness, losing your temper, anger, shouting, and slander, along with every other evil. Be kind, compassionate, and forgiving to each other, in the same way God forgave you in Christ." – Ephesians 4:31-32

On December 27, 1983, the world witnessed a most extraordinary act of forgiveness. In Rome's Rebibbia Prison, Pope John Paul II met for the first time with Mehmet Ali Agca, the very terrorist who shot him four times in St. Peter's Square just two and a half years earlier. The two men sat inches from each other for 21 minutes in Agca's cell, and as they clasped hands, John Paul uttered firmly, "I forgive you."

A convicted murderer, radical extremist, notorious thief, and prison escapee before he assaulted the pope, Agca hardly invited sympathy. Nonetheless, John Paul gave him that and so much more.

One of my favorite Contemporary Christian artists, Steve Taylor, wrote a song about this meeting title "To Forgive." The first line goes like this:

I saw a man
He was holding the hand
That had fired a gun at his heart
Oh, will we live
To forgive?

Forgiveness can be a challenge for us. Sometimes it's easy, other times so demanding it seems unthinkable. I don't know if I could find the strength under all circumstances, especially on those occasions when the perpetrator of a wrong exhibits no remorse. It seems to me that some measure of regret ought to be a prerequisite for forgiveness, yet some people offer it without condition. Perhaps they do so in the belief that it may induce the very contriteness the subject has yet to show.

Mehmet Ali Agca served nearly 30 years behind Italian and Turkish bars for his crime. While in prison, he became a Christian and a changed man. He was released in 2010. Four years later, on the anniversary of John Paul's prison visit, Agca traveled to the Vatican to lay roses on the late pope's tomb.

The second line of "To Forgive" goes like this:


I saw the eyes
And the look of surprise
As he left an indelible mark
Oh, will we live?
To forgive?

1 John 1:9 tells us that, "If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Forgiveness changes our life and leaves an indelible mark on the life we are willing to forgive. I do not completely understand the mystery of the power of forgiveness, but I do know we need more of it, perhaps a lot more of it in these days of conflict and tension. Some say our society is too far gone. But I am reminded of the final line to that Steve Taylor song:

I saw a man
With a hole in His hand
Who could offer the miracle cure
Oh, He said live
I forgive.







In Romans 4 Paul writes: "If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ... For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace" (v 14,16 NRSV). Here and elsewhere, Paul firmly explains that we are saved through God's grace, or unconditional love, made known most profoundly in Jesus Christ. But this passage raises a question: if belief (trust, faith) reckons us as righteous before God, what if we don't trust, can't believe, have lost all faith?

Pastor Martin Luther (1483—1546) assures us that even this is a gift of God: "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead *the Holy Spirit has* called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and *kept me in the true faith*" (*The Small Catechism*; emphasis added). Later in Romans, Paul declares that when we feel so lost (unbelieving, lacking in faith) that we don't even know how to pray, the "Spirit himself intercedes for us" (8:26, NIV). Rest assured, dear one: God's got you.

Living as Poetry of God (From the preface of Leaves of Grass, 1855)

For Christians, the Scriptures are our first source of guidance for how to live, and within them, Jesus is primary. But God speaks through non-biblical voices too: preachers and teachers not found in the Bible, and even literature that isn't directly Christian. God, who used King Cyrus of Persia to free the exiled Israelites, can use anyone to call us to right living. Take, for example, Walt Whitman's description of life as poetry when we live certain ways, and God as "the greatest poet":

"This is what you shall do: Love the earth and sun and the animals, despise riches, give alms to every one that asks, stand up for the [vulnerable], devote your income and labor to others, hate tyrants, argue not concerning God, have patience and indulgence toward the people, ... and your very flesh shall be a great poem and have the richest fluency. ... The known universe has one complete lover and that is the greatest poet. ... His love above all love has leisure and expanse."
