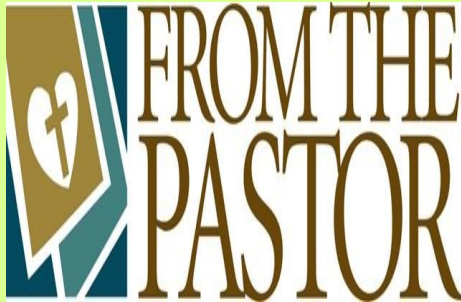

Seated at the table of the Upper Room, the Master looked into the faces of his followers. Tragedy lay just ahead. His death would be tomorrow, and He knew it. Their faith and confidence in Him would be shaken to the core. Try as hard as He might, Jesus was unable to get his followers to understand that death lay ahead of him. The disciples just didn't get it. It was not what they understood the mission of the Messiah to be. They simply could not grasp the depth of God's love for His friends. "God showed how much he loved us by sending his one and only Son into the world so that we might have eternal life through him. This is real love— not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins" 1 John 4:9-10 [NLB]. To get through the disappointment, horror and pain of the next few days, they would need to lean on each other, to depend on each other. And that would require love.



To reinforce that love, Jesus reminded them over and over, "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you." John 15:12 Love is not some warm fuzzy feeling. Nor is it measured by the acceptance of or the tolerance for another person. Love demands a commitment, a response to an injustice, an affirmation to indifference. "We know what real love is because Jesus gave up his life for us. So we also ought to give up our lives for our brothers and sisters. If someone has enough money to live well and sees a brother or sister in need but shows no compassion - how can God's love be in that person? Dear children, let's not merely say that we love each other; let us show the truth by our actions." 1 John 3:16-18 [NLB]

Love is never easy. In fact it's tough, really tough. "Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable, and it keeps no record of being wronged. It does not rejoice about injustice but rejoices whenever the truth wins out. Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance." 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 [NIV] I don't do well meeting these expectations.

Jesus laid out this responsibility for us, “If you keep my command, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father’s commands and remain in his love. John 15:10 [NIV] The only way we can meet our Lord’s call to love is to ask His Spirit to come to us and help us love others. During this Lenten season, join me as we pray for God’s love to fill us and guide our relationships so we are able to love others as our Heavenly Father has loved us.

In Matthew 17, we read a remarkable story about Jesus taking Peter, James and John up a high mountain. What seemed like an ordinary hike turned into a moment that changed their understanding of who Jesus really is. Matthew writes, “And He was transfigured before them; and His face shone like the sun, and His garments became white as light” (Matthew 17:2, NASB). The disciples saw Jesus in a brilliant, heavenly glory—a glimpse of his true identity as the Son of God.

But that wasn't all. A voice from the cloud declared, "This is My Beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him! (Matthew 17:5, NASB). Imagine the awe and holy fear those disciples felt. Just like many of us would, they fell to the ground, overwhelmed by God's presence. Yet Jesus didn't leave them trembling. He came close, touched them and said those comforting words we all long to hear: "Do not be afraid."

After the moment passed, Jesus led them back down the mountain and into everyday life again. This powerful encounter reminds us that Jesus is truly the Son of God –radiant, holy and worthy of our worship. But it also shows us his heart: gentle, reassuring and near to us when we are afraid.

We may not stand on that mountain, but we can still experience our own “mountain-top moments” - times in worships, prayer or Scripture when we glimpse God’s glory in a fresh way. And just like the disciples, we are invited to rise up, follow Jesus and listen to him every step of the journey.



How sincere are you, really? How honest, dependable, and genuine? These are traits that shape our character and help other see Christ in us.



The word sincere comes from an old Latin phrase meaning “without tax.” In ancient Rome, potters sometimes used wax to hide cracks in flawed pottery. Buyers would hold each piece up to the sunlight to see if it was truly and not hiding any imperfections.

When we allow the light of Christ to shine through our lives, it reveals both our rough spots and our strengths. The good news is that Jesus never shames us for the cracks; he restores us. As his light works within us, we grow into people of integrity who are whole, authentic, and sincerely his.

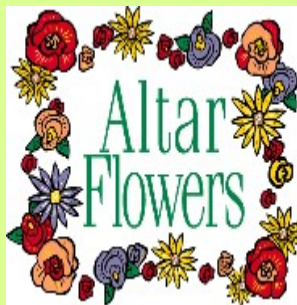
A Taste of Loving - Kindness
